#### About the Department

The Department of African Studies at the University of Delhi, founded in December 1954 through the efforts of first Prime Minister of India Pt. Jawaharlal Nehru, holds an important place in India's academic history. It became the first Department in India dedicated solely to African studies when it formally launched in August 1955. The Department functions as an Area Studies Department, focusing on the study of African history, sociology, culture, politics, geography, and economy, and alignment of these aspects with Africa, India, and global scenarios. The Indian government's goal of deepening India-Africa relations is reflected in shared struggles and aspirations.

The Department plays a key role in advancing the research on Africa through a bouquet of courses that include degrees, such as an MA, MPhil, PhD, Diplomas, and Certificate in subjects like Swahili and International Trade in Africa.

The Department offers courses that reflect its wide range of specialization, covering topics such as African History, Geography, Polity, Sociology, Economics and languages like Swahili. The MA program at the Department offers a wide range of topics, from international relations and development to African geography and history, providing students with a thorough grasp of Africa from a global perspective. ## Guidelines for submission of abstracts and full papers

- The Submissions must be original and not previously published or under consideration for publication elsewhere.
- The Full-length papers should be between 5000-6000 words.
- The Each paper should include an abstract of 250-300 words including include 4-6 keywords.
- APA 7th edition referencing style should be followed.
- The paper should be typed in MS word, Tittle 14 font, Text 12 font size, Times New Romania and 1.5 line spacing.
- The paper must have the name of the author(s), organization name and email id.
- The organising committee reserves the right to accept or reject the paper at their discretion.
- The Deadlines for submission to be followed.
- The Papers not abiding the submission guidelines may not be accepted. The Paper should be in English or Hindi language.
- Only one paper will be selected either a author or co-author.
- No more than two authors per paper will be accepted.

#### Note:

Full papers should include a separate page containing the title of the paper, suggested topic and Sub-theme, Name(s) of the author(s), Organisation/institution affiliation, Corresponding Author, Cell phone, Fax, and E-mail address.
